

Job Announcement

Great Streets Intern/Student Trainee Oakland Department of Transportation

The City of Oakland Department of Transportation (Oak-DOT) seeks to fill several part-time or full-time student trainee (internship) positions. This internship will provide the successful candidate an opportunity to develop the technical skills needed for a career in multimodal, mobility-focused transportation planning. The pay is approximately \$22.00 per hour. The successful candidate is expected to work no fewer than 15 hours per week for summer and/or fall 2017.

Interns may work a maximum of 960 hours per fiscal year (July 1 to June 30), and the duration of employment shall last no longer than 2 years, and is predicated on concurrent enrollment in school. Start date will be determined based on applicant availability and may occur as early as June 2017.

Interns will join one of the following work areas within the Great Streets Division:

- Vision Zero
- Street/Urban Design

Public Space

Qualifications for all positions

Student Status

Applicants must be students currently enrolled in at least one class or returning to school imminently. Degree programs could include City and Regional Planning, Transportation Engineering, Public Administration, Public Health or a program providing the requisite skills and abilities necessary.

Desired Skills or Qualities

- Strong project management skills and ability to work independently
- Creative problem-solving skills, and strong analytic skills
- Demonstrated ability to work as part of a team in a professional office environment, including excellent interpersonal communication skills
- Excellent writing and oral communication skills. Second language proficiencies encouraged.

- Familiarity with a range of software packages. Extensive knowledge of Microsoft Word and Microsoft Excel required. Experience using SketchUp, ArcGIS, AutoCAD, Microsoft Access, SPSS, SAS, and/or Adobe Creative Suite desirable.
- Comfort working in the field without supervision, and on projects in a self-directed manner
- Education and career goals in active transportation design, planning, and policy

Experience

No prior job experience is required. Any combination of experience and education that would likely provide the desired skills is qualifying. Competitive candidates will have a strong interest in multimodal transportation.

OakDOT's Great Streets Division Planning team is seeking to fill intern positions to support the following programs:

Vision Zero Program

Interns will help accomplish the objectives of the Department of Transportation's Holistic Community Safety goals within the Strategic Plan and will work as core members of the Vision Zero Program to analyze policies and street designs to ensure that safety of all road users is prioritized. Competitive candidates will have a strong interest in policy development, crash analysis, community engagement, as well as experience using Adobe Creative Suite software.

Typical duties may include, but are not limited, to:

- Evaluate existing policies and processes to identify opportunities to incorporate Vision
 Zero approaches
- Aggregate and analyze relevant data to assess existing improvements and remaining needs.
- Develop and apply criteria for evaluating efficacy of Vision Zero improvements
- Develop project concepts for Vision Zero improvements
- Support the coordination of the Vision Zero Task Force
- Develop outreach campaign strategies and collateral material

Street Design

Working closely with both planners and engineers, interns will help develop concepts for the next set of major plans and capital projects in Oakland, addressing transit, bicycle, and pedestrian improvements. Competitive candidates will have a basic understanding of NACTO design principles and a basic proficiency with SketchUp, will excel at project storytelling, and will have fresh ideas for inclusive community engagement.

Typical duties may include, but are not limited, to:

- Assess multimodal existing conditions to inform project development, including surveys, counts, demographic analyses, and network analyses
- Develop outreach campaign strategies and collateral material
- Apply design guidelines to propose multimodal improvements and develop project concepts
- Help maintain and refine database and GIS assets, and create GIS-based maps for projects and programs

Public Space

Interns will work with planners, engineers and community members to support the development of a public space program to serve the Oakland community. Competitive candidates may have a background in planning or urban design, graphic design, data analysis, and an interest in community engagement to develop creative solutions that reclaim streets as shared public space.

Typical duties may include, but are not limited, to:

- Develop and test new programming principles and policies
- Identify key community partners and support pilot projects
- Evaluate efficacy of projects and the program
- Conduct outreach especially to the City's low-income communities and communities of color to encourage equitable participation in the program
- Develop guidelines for implementing public space projects in the public right-of-way
