	The Director of Community Planning, the Community Communications Manager, and Program Interns work as a TODCO Community Planning and Advocacy Program team with the President to address the pivotal civic planning pocesses now underway that will determine the future of the SOMA Neighborhood. 	Specifically, the Director of Community Planning will: (1) monitor and evaluate civic and private planning and development activities impacting the South of Market Neighborhood and San Francisco; (2) engage with a range of community organizations to address the significant policy issues involved; (3) provide technical resources to TODCO's community planning and advocacy work.
	The Director of Community Planning will undertake other related responsibilities as directed by the President. Important specific tasks to complete in 2017-18 will be:
	 To finalize TODCO's "Central SOMA Community Plan" (now in draft) for incorporation in the City's Central Corridor Plan. This Plan is expected to be adopted by the City in 2017. To finalize the capital improvement plans for TODCO's Alice Street Community Gardens public open space and coordinate funding processes.
	These activities will include data sourcing, literature and field research, graphics preparation, and direct interaction with the public, community, and commercial entities involved.
	The Director of Community Planning supervises the Program Interns.
