Position Description

The Contra Costa County Public Works Department (CCCPWD) is seeking to hire two Watershed Management Planning Specialists (WMPS). CCCPWD maintains over 660 miles of roads, 150 miles of streams, channels and other drainage and over 200 County buildings throughout Contra Costa County. CCCPWD provides a wide range of services such as Parks and Recreation, Stormwater Permit Administration, Real Estate, Environmental Permit Review and Flood Control throughout unincorporated areas of Contra Costa County.

The WMPS positions are located in the Watershed Program and Clean Water Division of the CCCPWD and report to the Senior WMPS. WMPS assist with implementation of the regional storm water permit throughout the cities, towns and unincorporated areas of the County. The focus of the permit work is to prevent pollutants such as litter, micro plastics, oil, pesticides, legacy pollutants, and bacteria from entering nearby waterbodies. WMPS work within and outside the County to collaborate with different agencies to come up with innovative pollution prevention solutions. WMPS provide project management of water quality monitoring, public outreach with citizens and businesses, environmental inspections, meeting facilitation and training of municipal staff, and Green Infrastructure project development.

We are looking for someone who is:

- detail-oriented, with an understanding of the overall mission;
- able to display strong oral and written communication skills;
- sensitive and aware of political, citizen concerns and issues;
- customer-service oriented;
- a fast learner;
- and able to organize, plan, and prioritize tasks/work effectively.

What you will typically be responsible for:

- Reviewing, understanding technical regulations and reports, and communicating issues/opinions to colleagues/supervisor
- Gathering and compiling information for an annual report
- Facilitating meetings and training of various stakeholders, as appropriate

- Completing stormwater inspections
- Communicating with citizens, businesses, municipal staff to direct or coordinate services
- Researching and understanding water quality problems and working with stakeholders to find creative solutions
- Compiling and organizing data and presenting it to others
- Managing projects and consultant contracts

Minimum Qualifications

License Required: Possession of a valid California Motor Vehicle Operator's License. Out of State valid motor vehicle operator's license will be accepted during the application process.

Education: Possession of a Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university **with a major in urban or regional planning, engineering, business, geography, chemistry, environmental science or a closely related field.**

Experience: Three (3) years of full-time or its equivalent professional experience in land use planning, environmental compliance, or other closely related activity.

Substitution: A Master's degree from an accredited college or university in urban or regional planning, engineering, business, geography, chemistry, environmental science, or a closely related field may be substituted for one (1) year of the required experience.

Desirable Qualifications:

- Project management experience
- Experience in the stormwater field
- Stormwater certifications or coursework
- Experience doing facility inspections or coordinating information related to facility inspections
- Experience with green infrastructure projects
- Experience with Geographic Information Systems

- Experience designing or completing water quality monitoring studies

Selection Process

1. Application Filing and Evaluation: Applicants will be required to complete a supplemental questionnaire at the time of application, applications will be evaluated to determine which candidates will move forward in the next phase of the recruitment process.

2. Virtual Oral Interview: Candidates who possess the minimum qualifications will be invited via email to complete a HireVue On Demand video interview. The assessment will measure candidates' competencies as they relate to the Watershed Management Planning Specialist classification. These may include, but are not limited to: Critical Thinking, Delivering Results, Displaying Ownership and Accountability, Oral Communication, Political and Organizational Savvy, Project Management, and Innovating Problem Solving. **(Weighted 100%)**

- The Watershed Management Planning Specialist interview is tentatively scheduled to take place via computer (remotely) on the second week of February, 2022.
- The virtual oral interview will be administered remotely using a computer or mobile device such as a tablet. You will need access to a reliable internet connection to take the assessment, as well as computer or mobile device with a camera.

The Human Resources Department may change the examination steps noted above in accordance with the Personnel Management Regulations and accepted selection practices.

COVID-19 VACCINE REQUIREMENTS

CONVICTION HISTORY

After you receive a conditional job offer, you will be fingerprinted, and your fingerprints will be sent to the California Department of Justice (DOJ) and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). The resulting report of your conviction history (if any) will be used to determine whether the nature of your conviction conflicts with the specific duties and responsibilities of the job for which you have received a conditional job offer. If a conflict exists, you will be asked to present any evidence of rehabilitation that may mitigate the conflict, except when federal or state regulations bar employment in specific circumstances. Having a conviction history does not automatically preclude you from a job with Contra Costa County. If you accept a conditional job offer, the Human Resources department will contact you to schedule a fingerprinting appointment.

DISASTER SERVICE WORKER

All Contra Costa County employees are designated Disaster Service Workers through state and local law. Employment with the County requires the affirmation of a loyalty oath to this effect. Employees are required to complete all Disaster Service Worker-related training as assigned, and to return to work as ordered in the event of an emergency.
