What's the Role?

We're looking for an **innovate, passionate and collaborative professional to take on the role of Transportation Intern**. The ideal candidate would have a strong interest in transportation and urban planning, environmental sustainability and/or geographic information systems (GIS). You will join a **fast-paced, dynamic team environment, providing SERVICES within the Transportation and Business Services Division of the Public Works Department**. The selected individual must be prepared to work a hybrid schedule of both remote and onsite at the City of Mountain View (City Hall) with the internship starting in June 2023.

This is a part-time paid position, up to 30 hours per week and does not include benefits. The Intern position is a temporary assignment through summer or a part-time assignment during the semester or quarter session. This position includes flexible scheduling and college/university credit, as applicable. Interns receive direction and guidance from an intern host who is part of the management staff.

The Essentials

- Outstanding student at accredited university or college.
- A desire to tackle climate change, congestion, traffic and emissions by reducing reliance on single occupancy vehicles and parking demand.
- Enthusiasm for transportation and urban planning, sustainable transport and GIS.
- Ability to walk or bike along city streets for an extended period of time.
- Ability to work independently and on a broad range of project tasks.
- Possess strong analytical and quantitative skills.
- Interest in working for and understanding local government.

Bonus Points

- Current enrollment in a master's program related to transportation planning, urban/regional planning or GIS.
- Prior GIS experience.

What You'll Do

- Undertake cutting edge research on Transportation Demand Management (TDM) and parking policy, including quantitative analysis, report writing and presentations. This may include fieldwork and data analysis including some GIS.
- Advance the City's transit service planning efforts by analyzing pedestrian and bicycle access to transit (walk shed analysis) and opportunities for micromobility.
- Participate in transportation planning team activities and assist with other transportation projects and programs.
